

JEC Continues Post-Storm Cleanup

efferson Energy Cooperative continues its post-storm procedures, which were developed to assist in the restoration of our electrical system.

Phase 1—post-storm damage assessment—is nearly complete. We are now in the process of vegetation right-of-way cleanup and disaster-generated debris removal. Our cleanup efforts will focus on removing hazards and any materials left behind during restoration efforts to ensure your safety and reliable service (2267-001). While we are dedicated to restoring the system and ensuring reliable service, it's important to recognize that damaged trees continue to present a threat to our power lines and may lead to more frequent outages until the system can be restored to normal.

We appreciate your understanding as we work through these challenges and power is restored to its usual state. Please understand this process may take several months while we prioritize thoroughness and safety.


